A note of joyful expectation marks this Sunday's worship with the children's Pageant offering and in the various readings: Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom; James exhorts patience. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even we rejoice at his presence among us in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's Advent among us.

In the buzz that is the holiday season, it is quite likely that each of us brings with us a mix of hope and desperation – and the space between them makes all the difference in the world. As we reach the midpoint of Advent, may our desperation be dampened and our hope be manifest as we put Christ at the center of it all.

God willed that the Blessed Virgin Mary play a central part in the Mystery of the Incarnation and of our Redemption. He willed that the salvation of the world should depend on her consent. Mary is the "royal way" by which the King of Glory descended into the world in order to restore fallen mankind to its destined place in heaven...If we leave her out of the Sacrament of Advent we shall never fully penetrate its mystery, since we need to go forth to meet our Savior on the same road by which He came to us. ~ Thomas Merton, Seasons of Celebration
