Given the choice, I would prefer things not change. But given that it's in the nature of things to change (unless, perhaps, you're a rock and even then you change, albeit slowly) the question is how well you adapt to change.

Things are going to be changing in and around Good Shepherd with dazzling speed very soon. First of all, Angier School is going to come down this summer, to be replaced with a shiny new school in around 18 months. The result will be good for the children of Waban but rather inconvenient for Good Shepherd, at least in the short run. The most obvious loss will be the use we make of Angier's parking lot on Sunday morning. So those of you accustomed to using the Angier parking lot may need to leave home a few minutes early to find street parking on the surrounding streets or in Waban Square. That's not too much of a hardship, is it?

The second change is that I will be retiring as rector on November 2nd. You have heard a good deal about this already and will hear more come September but I just thought I would let you know that I'm buying a house in a co-housing community called Two Echo, which is in the woods around ten miles outside Brunswick, Maine. To find out what co-housing is you might want to google Two Echo. And then to see a picture of my house, click houses. Mine is 86 Echo Road. As to the question of what I'll be doing there, well, I must say that I don't have any idea. I've been only one thing for the past 40 years and what I'll be after I'm not a parish priest will only become clear in time.

The third change is that you'll be getting an interim rector and then in about a year or so, a new rector. The diocese appoints the interim, with the consent of the vestry, but Good Shepherd will decide who the new rector will be.

You received a letter from the vestry outlining some of this a couple of weeks ago. What I ask is that you give the wardens and the vestry your support as they take charge of this transition. The process won't be easy and there will inevitably be some bumps along the way but I have a lot of faith in the lay leadership of the parish and I know they'll do everything they can to make Good Shepherd an even more wonderful place.

I've received so many good things from Good Shepherd in my time in Waban---so much strength and self-knowledge. So much faith and hope for the journey. I hope you feel the same way. And now it's up to all of us to give this parish our love and support, so that it can continue to be a place where God is worshiped in truth and beauty and where generations to come may be comforted and strengthened for their journey. I'm counting on you.

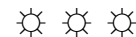
